Park/Performance Attire: Students are asked to **arrive** to Ainger in attire including, the black Ainger Band T-Shirt, blue jeans or shorts, and sneakers with socks. Attire must adhere to school dress code. If students are not dressed appropriately, they will be sent home and will not go on the trip. There will NOT be a refund.

Equipment: Students are required to bring their instruments, mouth pieces, reeds and/or sticks. Instruments will be loaded under the charter bus for the trip. Large percussion instruments will be provided by the performance organizers. If a student doesn't have the necessary equipment, they will be sent home and will NOT go on the trip. There will NOT be a refund.

Behavior: At the performance and while in the park, students will be representing L.A. Ainger Middle School. This means that their behavior reflects on Mr. Ostrow, their parents, and their school. The students must conduct themselves in a manner that is professional and respectful. Even though we are not at school, the same rules and consequences of school apply. If any student is caught out of their group, alone, or if there is a behavioral issue, the student will be disciplined. In an extreme case, a parent may be called to pick up their child. The issue will also be addressed with administration the following Monday morning and will be handled appropriately.

Food: Students are responsible for their OWN Dinner before we depart the theme park. Students will be provided with one meal pass for lunch. Please bring money for additional FOOD, Snacks, and Souvenirs. We recommend \$20 as park food is pricey. Chaperones will NOT be responsible for any money that students bring. Students WILL be required to carry their own money and items that are brought into the park. This should be something that fits in your pocket or a fanny pack.

Other: Students are NOT permitted to bring the following items: Prescription Medication, Non Prescription Medication, Blankets, and Energy Drinks. If students bring any electronics, they will be responsible for them. LA Ainger Middle School, the Band Boosters, Chaperones or other students are not responsible for them.
